14 April 2025	Tone Starting with a demonstration the day will begin with an instructive introduction to painting. We will be looking at how to apply a ground, lay out your palette and the best way to mix a simple, tonal scale. AM Still Life: Using a limited pallet Students will work from a simple arrangement of white objects in order to understand light, shadow, shape and contrast. PM Life Painting: A fun introduction to oil paint working from the life model. Continuing with the same limited pallet students will be shown some basic measuring techniques and how to apply these in order to achieve a more accurate painting. 15 April 2025	Colour The day will start with an introduction to colour mixing, learning about how colour works and colour 5 relativity. Then combining this with what was learnt on the first day, students will have the option to either copy a portrait painting or do a painting of a still life in full colour. You will also be guided by your tutor on all aspects of colour mixing and learn some techniques on how to match the colours you are seeing.	NO
16 April 2025	Landscape Working from your own photographs, or images provided by your tutor, you will spend the day making a landscape painting. Students will combine ideas and concepts from earlier in the week to generate a sense of space and depth within their paintings, match colours and experiment with the application of paint.	NO
