Course overview

Develop your portrait drawing skills on this course, focusing on aspects such as facial proportion, facial anatomy and skull structure. You'll draw from live models in a range of materials, including charcoal, graphite and Conte, and create anatomical drawings of the skull to develop your understanding of the structure and form of the head. You'll then use these skills to complete a sustained three-week portrait drawing towards the end of the course.

Your tutor will support you fully throughout the course in both group sessions and one-to-one, providing regular feedback, critique and constructive advice.

Learning outcomes

Students will be able to:

Create portrait drawings using light, shadow, tone, to create volume and mass.

Apply measuring techniques, taking into consideration specific aspects of proportion of the head.

Understand and employ anatomical approaches to drawing of the skull for underlying structure and correctly depict the surface forms of the head.

Apply an improved understanding of facial anatomy.

Create a sustained two week portrait drawing.

Apply safe-working practices at all times.

What Level is the course and do I need any particular skills?

This course is suitable for all levels.

About your tutor

Mark Entwisle studied printmaking at Cambridge College of Art and Technology, and then completed a degree in illustration at Brighton. He went on to work as an illustrator for 15 years, with clients including Penguin, Random House and the National Theatre. During this time he began to exhibit, and in 1990 Mark had his first exhibition at Beaux Arts Bath.

Mark has been the recipient of many prestigious awards and prizes, such as: the BP Portrait Award; the RA Summer Show; The Discerning Eye; and the Lynn Painters-Stainers Prize. Mark also teaches part-time at the National Portrait Gallery.
