Course overview

This course focuses on experimenting with a combination of traditional printmaking techniques including simple block-print, etching, collagraph and mono-print to develop a print or series of prints. Printmaking both complements and brings perspective to other areas of creative practice. Many printmaking techniques involve drawing in its many forms and the techniques taught on this course will bring a new perspective and enjoyment to this fundamental artist's skill. This course is ideal for artist practitioners working in any medium who would like to gain an understanding of print techniques and re-engage with the drawn mark.

Learning Outcomes

Students will be able to:

- Use printmaking tools and equipment correctly and safely.
- Create images using experimental combinations of printmaking techniques.
- Apply graphic mark making, intaglio and block print techniques in the creation of prints.
- Create a final print or series of prints, applying printmaking and editioning techniques.
- Research, plan and complete a self initiated project
- Apply safe working practices at all times.

What Level is the course and do I need any particular skills?

Suitable for beginners to printmaking and for those with some experience.

About your tutor

Temsüyanger Longkumer is a London-based interdisciplinary artist working in media including drawing, installations, printmaking, and time-based art. His work explores subjects ranging from the flux of contemporary culture and politics to ideas conceived serendipitously.

Temsü has an MA in Printmaking from the Royal College of Art. His work has been widely exhibited, featuring prominently at prestigious events such as the Venice Biennale, Kochi Biennale, and Singapore Biennale. His pieces have also been hosted by notable institutions including the Museum der Kulturen in Switzerland, the India International Centre in New Delhi, Pitt Rivers Museum in Oxford, and the Horniman Museum in London, where one of his sculptures resides in their permanent collection.

Recognized with multiple international awards and scholarships, Temsü has undertaken residencies at esteemed institutions, including the Fondazione Pistoletto in Italy, Lalit Kala Akademi in India, Pepperton UK in London, Cite International Des Arts in Paris, and the Museum of Archaeology and Anthropology in Cambridge.

Temsü also works at Paupers Press, a fine art print and publishing studio that collaborate with many leading

contemporary artists such as Bill Viola, Brian Eno, Cornelia Parker, Damien Hirst, Glenn Brown, Grayson Berry, Jake and Dinos Chapman, Paula Rego, Peter Blake and Rachel Whiteread. <http://www.temsuyanger.com>

Weekly breakdown

Below is a weekly breakdown of what will be covered. Please bear in mind that these sessions will move with the pace of the group, so a degree of flexibility of what will be covered on which day will be employed.

1	17/09/25	Introduction Introduction to the course and visit to a contemporary art exhibition or public collection if a relevant show is accessible. Followed by a demonstration of Monoprint both using a plate and by impressing the paper onto an inked surface.	Temsuyanger Longkumer Gallery TBC	Sketchbook, visual reference material, basic drawing kit, camera/phone, A4 folder/box etc to store/ transport work in.
2	24/09/25	Etching Zinc You will learn to prepare and develop hard-ground etching plates in the morning. The afternoon will be spent printing the etchings and combining the plates with a simple block-print technique using colour.	Studio 1/ Print Temsuyanger Longkumer	Images or ideas that you would like to develop into prints. We will be working on plates measuring 16 x 22cm.
3	01/10/25	Adding Drypoint and tone The plates will be developed by using aquatint either directly onto the original plate or by using a second plate. In the afternoon there will be a demonstration of spit-bite etching.	Studio 1/ Print Temsuyanger Longkumer	See first and second weeks.
4	08/10/25	Collagraph You will learn how to prepare and develop a collagraph plate, which will serve as an additional layer to the etching plate prepared in week 2 and 3.	Studio 1/ Print Temsuyanger Longkumer	See first and second weeks.
5	15/10/25	You will learn the process of producing a series of prints using multiple plates and various mediums, utilising plates prepared in week 2, 3 & 4.	Studio 1/ Print Temsuyanger Longkumer	See second, third and fourth weeks.
6	22/10/25	Mixed Media in Contemporary Print Practice self-led project You will apply skills learnt to develop a series of hybrid prints using a combination of techniques learned in weeks 1-5 including mono-print, etching, drypoint, collagraph and block-print supported by one to one advice from the tutor.	Studio 1/ Print Temsuyanger Longkumer	Bring in visual research material to support your personal 6 week project.

YOU MUST BRING YOUR OWN MATERIALS.

There is a materials fee for this course which must be paid the first week of term. This fee includes plates/blocks, paper, inks, chemicals, grounds and all printmaking sundries. **The cost of materials for the course is £40 per student.** You will be required to buy your own wood/lino/metal for your project in the latter part of the course and if your project is large scale or beyond the normal scope of the workshop's provision you may also need to purchase your own paper and other media etc.

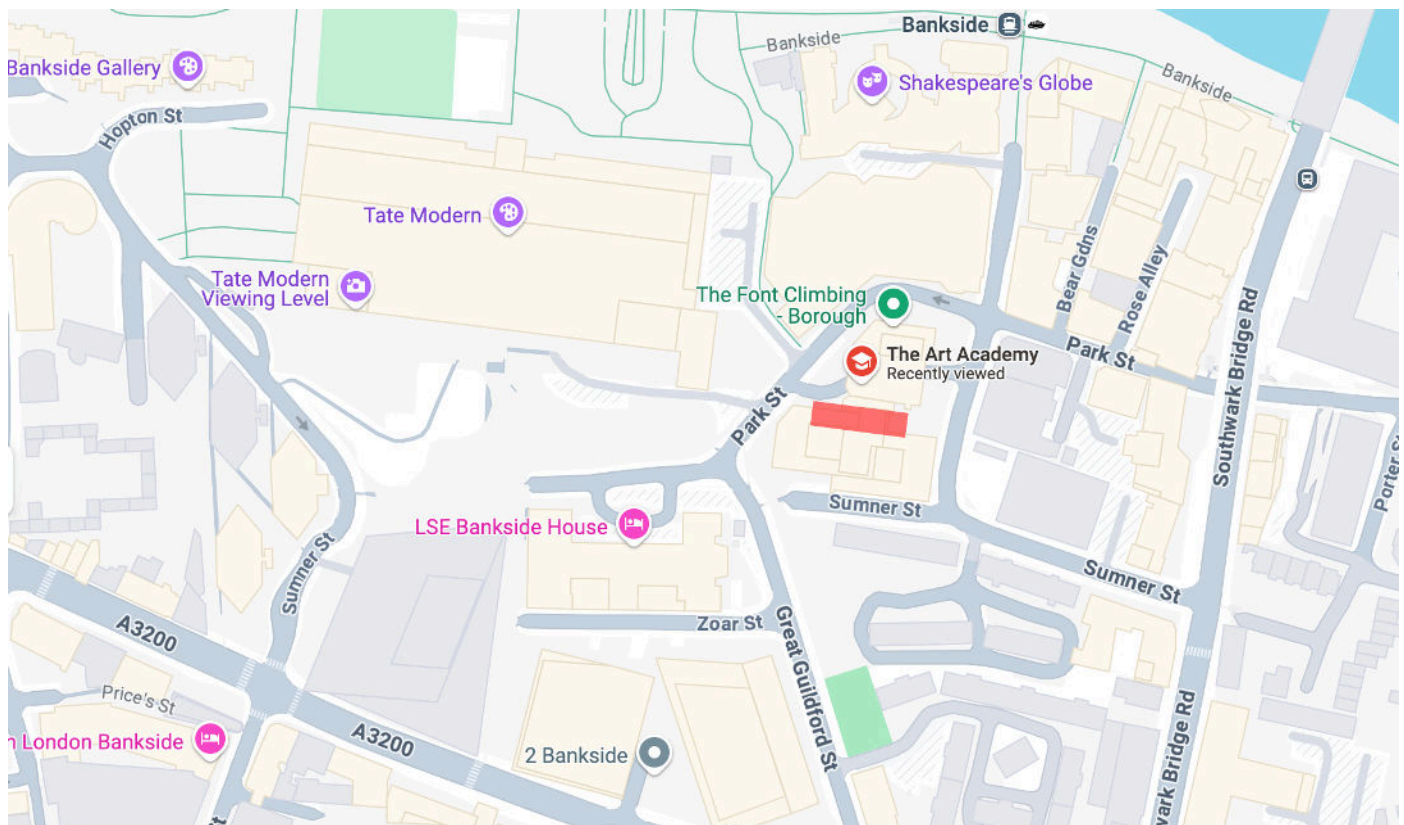
