Course overview

This course focuses on photomechanical techniques in printmaking, combining photosensitive emulsion and plates with intaglio printing. You will learn to expose and develop autographic (drawn and painted) and digitally generated/photographic images with both different types of plates.

Throughout the course we will be talking through your ideas, gaining the understanding of your individual creative process and maximising your ability to produce more technically advanced and developed artwork. During the second half of the course you will plan a self-led project using both technical and conceptual ideas to produce a small finished print edition.

Learning outcomes

Students will be able to:

Analyse the work of others, applying findings to own work. Prepare autographic (hand drawn) and digital (photographic) transparent positives on photosensitive plates. Apply a range of photomechanical etching techniques in the creation of prints. Research, plan and complete a self initiated project Apply safe-working practices at all times.

What Level is the course and do I need any particular skills?

This course is suitable for all levels.

About your tutor

Following a First Class Honours Degree in Illustration from Middlesex University in 2007 **Frederic Morris** went on to study Fine Art Printmaking at the Royal College of Art, where he received his MA in 2009. Frederic has shown continuously throughout the globe and has picked up numerous prizes for his printmaking and drawing skills. He is represented by Pratt Contemporary.

Weekly breakdown

3	29th January 2025	Photopolymer: Photographic positive You will create and edit a digital image file in Photoshop and print the positive using an inkjet printer in the Digital Media Suite. The positive is exposed on the UV unit, developed and cured before printing the plate on the etching press in the afternoon. Depending on class progress work may be completed in Wk4.	Bankside Digital Suite Frederic Morris	As above - ideally prescanned if relevant and brought on a memory stick - lowest resolution 300 dpi Meet in print studio - we will also be working in the Digital Suite
4	5th February 2025	Photo Etching: Preparing the hand drawn and photographic positives You will continue to work with plates from previous weeks. During the day you will also prepare an A5 zinc plate with an aquatint for use with stencils. An addition of hard/soft ground might also be added to enhance the image further. Preparation Requirements & Additional Costs

Materials for this course must be paid for, including plates, paper, inks, chemicals, grounds and various sundries. The basic materials cost for the course is £40 per student, payable at the start of the course. The tutor will advise on extra costs depending upon how many plates you create.

You must purchase your own materials. Art Academy London provides tools, presses and etching sundries in the Print Studio and there is availability for you to purchase individual paper and plates. You can choose to supply your own inks and extender or pay a service fee of £10 per session to access the available colours and extender stocked by AAL.
