Course overview

An introduction to art making with wood. Starting with the art historical context of sculpting with wood, you will discover how to construct with wood, use found materials, create a wood carving and experiment with surface finishes.

Learning outcomes

Students will be able to:

Develop an awareness of the art historical context of wood sculpture. Identify different types of wood and their applications in sculpture.

Construct with wood using various joining techniques.

Identifying and experimenting with using found wood materials.

Work with wood cutting and shaping tools and machinery.

Carve a sculpture in wood using carving gouges and chisels.

Correctly sharpen chisels.

Experiment with surface finishes on wood.

Beginners and intermediate.
